

The Rebuild India Fund is India's largest portfolio of community-led, grassroots NGOs. An initiative launched by Dasra and Tarsadia Foundation, Rebuild provides long-term, flexible funding and capacity-building support to NGOs led by proximate leaders – those who belong to and work closely with the most vulnerable and marginalized communities across India.

Rebuild first evolved out of Dasra's Covid relief campaign, #BacktheFrontline, launched in April 2021, in response to the peak of the Covid pandemic's second wave in India. We have shaped Rebuild as a growing, power-sharing, open-source multi-stakeholder platform creating path-breaking trust between funders, proximate leaders and vulnerable communities.

Inside is a look at our portfolio's current coverage with 170+ NGO partners selected through a rigorous participatory process and recommendations by 40+ non-profit networks and ecosystem stakeholders.
